

Chief Kenny Seymour began his law enforcement career in 1989 as a patrol officer with the Rosenberg Police Department. He spent 14 years working in an undercover capacity for the department. In 1997, he was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and was in charge of field operations at the Fort Bend Task Force. In 2004 he was promoted to the Division Commander over the Criminal Investigative Division where he served until 2008.

During the 20 years Chief Seymour served at the Rosenberg Police Department, he served for 17 years on the S.W.A.T team as an Operator, Team Leader and Commander. In October of 2008, Chief Seymour retired from the Rosenberg Police Department. In March of 2009, Chief Seymour was hired by the Fulshear Police Department where he is currently employed as the Chief of Police.

Chief Seymour holds a Master Peace Officer Certificate. He is currently attending LEMIT (Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas) leadership Command College LCC course which he will complete this summer. He is a certified instructor in ALERRT, Diversionary Devices, Use of Force, Fitness Instructor (Coopers Institute), and has a TCOLE (Texas Commission on Law Enforcement) Police Instructor certificate and Firearms certificate. Chief Seymour currently teaches in the areas of "Patrol Tactics," Active Shooter (ALERRT) Basic, Advanced Narcotics Investigations and SWAT performance courses as well as other courses related to this field.
