WHY ARE MY CALLS TO FULSHEAR POLICE BEING REROUTED TO THE SHERIFF?

The following is taken from a Facebook post about our Fulshear Police Department.

Fulshear police are just plain awesome! I saw the chief of police directing first-day-of-school traffic last week. They are incredibly responsive and proactive with communication—even when they have given me news I didn’t like (about temporary traffic lol). **When I asked how we could give back, their response was, “Your support is all we ask for.”**

We have had several inquiries lately about you being connected to the Fort Bend County Sheriff’s Office when you call the Fulshear Police Department. Just a short while ago, Fulshear Police officers were able to answer calls directly and respond immediately to those phone calls. As the city has grown exponentially, the Police Department found it was more difficult for officers to answer calls while performing other duties. Guess we have just grown too fast.

Therefore, the City is utilizing the Sheriff’s Office to take calls and then dispatch to the closet Fulshear Police officer on duty. The primary reason for this change is safety. In some instances, over the past few months, officers have been involved in serious calls only to have to try to answer an incoming call, take that information and continue on with the task at hand. Secondly, to protect everyone, calls should be recorded. Should there be a serious incident, a local court will want to have as much information as possible to determine suspect, victims, time of incident, tone of callers, etc. Gone are the days when you could just call and get one of the officers on the phone. One day in the not too far future, the Police Department will have its own dispatch.

As always, in an emergency, dial 911. In a non-emergency situation, please dial 281-341-4665 #1. If you need to contact FPD administration, please call 281-346-8888 Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.

If you have not paid your annual fee for membership in the Foundation, it is never too late. Your membership will be good for the entire year from when you renew. It is only \$50 for the year and your donation could help make it possible for our Police Department to have their own Fulshear Police Dispatch sooner.


